The National Education Policy-2020, mainly emphasis, on improvement of quality of higher education, which plays an extremely important role in promoting human as well as societal wellbeing and in developing India as envisioned in its Constitution. Quality of higher education is must aim to develop good, thoughtful, well-rounded, and creative individuals. It must enable an individual to study one or more specialized areas of interest at a deep level, and also develop character, ethical and Constitutional values, intellectual curiosity, scientific temper, creativity, spirit of service. A quality higher education must enable personal accomplishment and enlightenment, constructive public engagement, and productive contribution to the society. It must prepare students for more meaningful and satisfying lives and work roles and enable economic independence.

In this connection the Secretary, APSCHE, Mangalagiri, in his letter cited in the 1<sup>st</sup> reference, requested the Commissioner of Collegiate Education, AP (CCE-AP) to initiate the process of conversion of three majors into single majors in all Government Degree Colleges to be in effect from 2023-24 academic year

By taking into account of the prevailing scenario in the Colleges, to design the overall development of the student in multifaceted way with available infrastructure in the Colleges, sanctioned posts, admissions made in the Colleges for the past three years, series of meetings have been convened on conversion of existing UG Programs in Three Majors to Single Major from the Academic Year 2023 -2024, with **Principals, IQAC Coordinators and Subject Experts from the Government Degree Colleges**, to represent a student in a society to meet the global challenges after completion of their under graduation, in the job market, on the strength of the representations received from all Government Degree College Principals in the State, to change the old adopted programs to meet the global demand, series of meetings have been conducted in various platforms with subject experts and other academicians including all the Principals of Government Degree Colleges and during the course of deliberate discussions and suggestions made by them, at their request, the single major programmes are finalized.

### Introduction

Numbers have fascinated mathematicians for millennia, holding secrets that unlock a world of relationships and patterns. This project delves into three fundamental concepts that have been instrumental in unraveling these mysteries: Greatest Common Divisor (GCD), Diophantine Equations, and their solutions.

Our journey begins with the concept of GCD, a cornerstone of number theory. Its origins can be traced back to ancient civilizations like the Babylonians and Greeks, who intuitively grasped the importance of finding the largest number that divides two integers evenly. The Euclidean Algorithm, developed by the brilliant Greek mathematician Euclid around 300 BC, provides a systematic and efficient method to calculate the GCD. This elegant algorithm, still used today, lays the foundation for our further exploration.

Next, we encounter Diophantine Equations, named after the 3rd-century Greek mathematician Diophantus. These equations challenge us to find integer solutions ( $x$ ,  $y$ , and potentially  $z$ ) that satisfy a specific linear relationship. For instance, the equation  $ax + by = c$  asks for integer values of  $x$  and  $y$  that, when multiplied by coefficients  $a$  and  $b$  and added together, result in the integer  $c$ . The resolution of these equations not only requires an understanding of GCD but also reveals fascinating connections between divisibility and integer solutions.

Finally, we extend our investigation to three-variable Diophantine Equations of the form  $ax + by + cz = k$  and furthermore the case of  $n$  variables. Building upon the knowledge gained from two-variable equations and GCD, we explore the existence and methods for finding solutions in this more complex setting.

A numerical example on time scales is provided to validate the theoretical results.

In this paper, we investigate the existence of solutions for an  $n$ th-order dynamic boundary value problem (BVP) on a time scale  $T$ , incorporating both **iterative boundary conditions** and **Sturm-Liouville boundary conditions**. The problem we consider is expressed as follows: We study the  $n$ th-order dynamic equation on the time scale  $T$ :

subject to the combined boundary conditions:
